## **Student Residence Permit Application**

The school provides assistance in issuing or extending residence permits for students over 18 and for a parent whose spouse has returned to their home country. If one of your family members falls into one of these two categories and their residence permit is set to expire before November 30, 2025, please inform the school by completing this survey (LINK) by January 24, 2025. We will follow up with those who complete the survey to start the application process.

## Winter MAP® Testing

As part of the LifePlus network of schools, YHIS is conducting the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) tests as a form of standardized testing from Tuesday, January 7, to Friday, January 24. The testing date

and time for each grade varies. For Elementary, new students will take tests in Math, Language, Reading, and Science, while those in the ELS program will only take the Reading test. For Secondary, MAP Testing will be administered only to new students from semester 1 and individuals who scored below their expected level. MAP Testing takes place in the Fall, Winter, and Spring of each school year. The tests will be administered on school computers or iPads.

MAP tests determine your child's instructional level and measure academic growth, both throughout the school year and from year to year, in the areas of Math, Language, Reading, and Science. MAP tests are unique in that they are adaptive tests. That means that the test becomes more difficult with the more questions your child answers correctly. When your child incorrectly answers a question, the test becomes easier. Therefore, your child will take a test specifically catered to his or her learning level.

Since MAP Growth tests provide immediate and accurate information about your child's learning, teachers use this information to identify students with similar scores that are generally ready for

instruction in similar skills and topics. They then plan their instruction accordingly so that students learn optimally.

There is no additional studying that students need to put in for this test. Rather, the test serves as an assessment tool for where a student's levels are currently. The school is excited to focus on your child's individual growth and achievement.


### Yunnan Service Trip Opportunity
